# A BILL

- To establish a grant program under which the Secretary of Transportation will reimburse public transportation agencies that offer free unlimited transportation passes to eligible individuals.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.

4 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the

5 "Transportation Equity Act".

#### 1 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF GRANT PROGRAM.

2 The Secretary of Transportation shall establish a
3 program to reimburse eligible public transportation agen4 cies that provide eligible individuals a free unlimited trans-

5 portation pass (to be known as a "T-U Pass").

#### 6 SEC. 3. ELIGIBLE AGENCIES.

7 A public transportation agency is eligible to partici-8 pate in the program if the agency—

9 (1) at the time of application, receives funds
10 pursuant to the surface transportation block grant
11 program described in section 133 of title 23, United
12 States Code;

(2) for each year beginning in the year that is
five years before the date of application, has received
funding for public transportation projects pursuant
to programs described in chapter 53 of title 49,
United States Code;

1	(3) provides a monthly, flat-rate, unlimited
2	transportation pass for purchase by any individual;
3	and
4	(4) agrees to establish a separate T-U Pass for
5	eligible individuals.
6	SEC. 4. ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.
7	The following individuals are eligible to receive a free
8	T-U Pass:
9	(1) An individual aged 60 and older.
10	(2) An individual with a disability (as defined
11	in section 3 of the Americans with Disabilities Act
12	of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12102)).
13	(3) An individual who receives a means-tested
14	benefit, as determined by the Secretary.
15	(4) A low-income individual (as defined in this
16	Act).
17	(5) The spouse of an individual described in
18	paragraphs (1) through (4) who lives with such indi-
19	vidual.
20	(6) The unmarried dependent of an individual
21	described in paragraphs $(1)$ through $(4)$ who lives
22	with such individual.

#### 1 SEC. 5. ELIGIBLE SERVICES AND REQUIREMENTS.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subject to subsection (b), a T-U
3 Pass shall only provide general transportation services and
4 not premium transportation services.

5 (b) EXCEPTION FOR CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS.—A pub6 lic transportation agency may seek a waiver from the Sec7 retary to provide a T-U Pass that provides premium trans8 portation services to an eligible individual who the transit
9 agency determines—

10 (1) has no access to reasonably accessible trans11 portation access points and is not eligible for para12 transit transportation services; or

(2) is disabled and whose principal place of residence, primary or specialist medical facilities, educational facilities, or place of employment is not
within one half-mile of a transportation access point
that contains the necessary infrastructure for the individual to use public transportation.

(c) T-U PASS REQUIREMENTS.—A T-U Pass shall
provide unlimited access to public transportation and shall
be valid for all schedules, times, and periods the transportation agency offers service.

23 (d) AUTOMATIC MONTHLY LOADING CAPABILITY OF
24 TRANSPORTATION BENEFITS.—A T-U Pass shall—

1	(1) be able to receive funds remotely or be load-
2	ed with funds automatically on the first day of each
3	calendar month; and
4	(2) make such funds available upon entrance or
5	boarding at the first transportation access point on
6	the first day the T-U Pass is used in such month.
7	(e) WAIVER FOR CERTAIN PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION
8	AGENCIES.—The Secretary may waive a requirement
9	under subsection (d) if the Secretary determines that—
10	(1) a public transportation agency cannot meet
11	such requirement because of infrastructure limita-
12	tions, cost inefficiencies, inability to finance, or un-
13	available technology; and
14	(2) the transportation agency provides a T-U
15	Pass that—
16	(A) only functions at entry and exit points
17	of the transit system; or
18	(B) only permits transactions of transpor-
19	tation-related expenses at facilities operated by
20	the transportation agency, including—
21	(i) booths or automated vending ma-
22	chines at transportation access points oper-
23	ated by the transit agency;
24	(ii) telephone or online interfaces op-
25	erated by the transit agencies; and

(iii) additional facilities as determined
 by the Secretary.

3 (f) ROLLOVER PROHIBITED.—Any funds that are
4 disbursed to a T-U Pass shall be surrendered if not used
5 in the course of the month for which such benefits were
6 provided.

7 (g) PROHIBITION OF DUPLICATIVE TRANSPOR8 TATION BENEFITS.—Grants made pursuant to the pro9 gram shall not be used to reimburse more than one T10 U Pass per individual.

#### 11 SEC. 6. FEATURES OF T-U PASS.

(a) EXPIRATION.—Subject to section 11, a T-U Pass
expires one year after issuance, and a public transportation agency may not terminate the validity of the T-U
Pass until the date of expiration regardless of whether the
individual continues to be eligible under section 4 of this
Act.

(b) DESIGN.—A public transportation agency receiving a grant pursuant to the program shall select a design
that distinguishes the T-U Pass from other passes. The
T-U Pass shall—

- 22 (1) be a card, ticket, or voucher;
- (2) include the words "Photo ID T-U Pass" onthe front and back;

1	(3) include the words "If found, please return
2	to" immediately followed by the address of the
3	issuing office of the transportation agency;
4	(4) include a photo of the person to whom the
5	T-U Pass was provided;
6	(5) include a seal with the logo of the transpor-
7	tation agency;
8	(6) include the full name of such eligible per-
9	son;
10	(7) include the expiration date of the T-U Pass;
11	and
12	(8) include any additional features the Sec-
13	retary determines is necessary.
14	SEC. 7. PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY.
15	An individual seeking a T-U Pass must provide to
16	the public transportation agency—
17	(1) proof of the basis of at least one ground of
18	eligibility described section 4; and
19	(2) documentation the Secretary determines is
20	necessary to support the basis of eligibility.
21	SEC. 8. APPLICATION AND SELECTION.
22	The Secretary shall award grants on a competitive
23	basis and may require that an application from a public

and manner and that it contains specified agreements, as surances, and information.

3 SEC. 9. AMOUNT OF REIMBURSEMENT TO TRANSIT AGEN-4 CIES.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Grants made pursuant to the pro6 gram shall be used only to reimburse a public transpor7 tation agency for the cost of providing a T-U Pass.

8 (b) AMOUNT OF REIMBURSEMENT.—A public trans9 portation agency shall be eligible to receive reimbursement
10 for each T-U Pass at the cost charged for a monthly, flat11 rate, unlimited transportation pass.

12 (c)EXCEPTION DISCOUNTED FOR MONTHLY PASSES.—If an eligible individual is eligible for a reduced-13 cost monthly, flat-rate, unlimited transportation pass for 14 15 reasons including disability or age, the public transportation agency shall be eligible to receive compensation 16 17 equaling the cost of such reduced-cost pass.

#### 18 SEC. 10. REPORTS FROM AGENCIES.

A public transportation agency receiving a grant
under this Act shall provide to the Secretary an annual
report explaining—

- (1) the agency's plan to annually verify the eli-gibility of holders of a T-U Pass; and
- 24 (2) the number of T-U Passes that have been25 terminated pursuant to section 11.

# 1 SEC. 11. TERMINATION OF BENEFITS UNDER CERTAIN CIR 2 CUMSTANCES.

3 (a) FRAUD AND SALE.—The Secretary shall establish
4 procedures for termination of a T-U Pass if—

5 (1) an individual obtains or uses the T-U Pass
6 fraudulently; or

7 (2) an individual sells, distributes, or provisions
8 the T-U Pass to an individual other than the indi9 vidual to whom the T-U Pass was provided.

10 (b) PROCEDURES.—The procedures required by sub11 section (a) shall include notice, opportunity for hearing,
12 and civil monetary penalties.

# 13 SEC. 12. RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.

14 Nothing in this Act shall be construed to limit any
15 other programs that are sponsored by public transpor16 tation agencies to provide free transportation to eligible
17 individuals.

# 18 SEC. 13. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

19 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums20 as may be necessary to carry out this Act.

# 21 SEC. 14. DEFINITIONS.

- 22 In this Act:
- (1) DEPENDENT.—The term "dependent" has
  the meaning given such term in section 152 of the
  Internal Revenue Code of 1986, except that the term
  also includes an individual who is not a citizen or

national of the United States if such individual
 would otherwise be considered a dependent pursuant
 to such section if such individual were a citizen or
 national of the United States.

5 (2) ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL.—The term "eligible
6 individual" means an individual described in section
7 4.

8 (3) GENERAL TRANSPORTATION SERVICE.—The 9 term "general transportation service" means a 10 transportation service that is subject to the same 11 base fare established by the transportation agency 12 for local or general service.

(4) LOW-INCOME INDIVIDUAL.—The term "lowincome individual" means, with respect to any calendar year, any individual who lives in a household
that has a gross income that does not exceed 300
percent of the poverty line, as defined in section
673(2) of the Community Services Block Grant Act
(42 U.S.C. 9902(2)).

20 (5) MEANS-TESTED BENEFIT.—The term
21 "means-tested benefit" means a mandatory spending
22 program of the Federal Government for which, as
23 determined by the Secretary, eligibility for the pro24 gram's benefits, or the amount of such benefits, is

1	determined on the basis of income or resources of
2	the individual or family seeking the benefit.
3	(6) PARATRANSIT SERVICES.—The term "para-
4	transit services" means service to individuals with
5	disabilities that is comparable to the level of service

6 provided to individuals without disabilities who use 7 routes operated by the public transportation agency.

8 (7) PREMIUM TRANSPORTATION SERVICE.—The 9 term "premium transportation service" means a 10 transportation service that is not a general transpor-11 tation service.

12 (8) PROGRAM.—The term "program" means 13 the grant program established pursuant to section 2. 14 (9) REASONABLY ACCESSIBLE.—The term "reasonably accessible" means, with respect to a trans-15 16 portation access point, a transportation access point 17 within one half-mile of the eligible individual's prin-18 cipal place of residence.

19 "Secretary" (10)SECRETARY.—The term 20 means the Secretary of Transportation.

(11) T-U PASS.—The term "T-U Pass" means 21 22 the unlimited transportation pass established pursu-23 ant to the program.

24 (12) TRANSPORTATION ACCESS POINT.—The term "transportation access point" means a bus 25

- 1 stop, a train, subway, or rail station, or any similar
- 2 fixed infrastructure used by passengers to embark
- 3 and disembark mass-transit service.
