The funding will support a project that will implement capital bus and safety improvements along Woodhaven Boulevard between 107th Avenue and Union Turnpike, to complement operational bus improvements first introduced in this corridor in 2017. The project will construct or reconstruct bus pads, concrete medians, pedestrian refuges, and curb extensions throughout the corridor limits to improve bus operations, pedestrian safety, and accessibility. The scope also includes street furniture to support bus operations, street lighting analysis and upgrades, and wayfinding signage.

The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because the Woodhaven Select Bus Service corridor is a major north-south transit connection in Queens, linking the Rockaway Peninsula to Queens Boulevard and several subway connections to the broader citywide network. Weekday bus ridership along the Woodhaven Boulevard corridor currently averages about 33,000 on the Q52/Q53 Limited-stop bus routes, Q11/21/22 Local bus routes, and QM15/16/17 and BM5 Express bus routes. This project will complement existing operational improvements and further enhance bus operations and speeds, providing vital transit connections for outer borough communities without direct access to the subway.
